WORLD RECORD HUNKS IN SEATTLE MAY 1 TO FLEX FOR OPENING DAY ON THE WATER

Daring Local Ocean Crossers to Lead Parade of Boats

Seattle, WA - They conquered wind, waves and whales when they crossed the Atlantic Ocean...in a rowboat. So they think they can handle the Montlake Cut.

Atlantic Ocean Rowing Race veterans Jordan Hanssen and Greg Spooner, as well as Olympic Gold Medalist Adam Kreek and former UW rower Richard Tarbill are available for media interviews and/or photos Saturday, May 1 in Seattle.

Hanssen and Spooner were half of the first team to ever row unassisted across the Atlantic from mainland U.S. to mainland U.K. They will attempt another world-record crossing with Kreek and Tarbill replacing two previous team-members.

The record-setting men and the actual craft that made the trip will lead the parade of boats immediately following the Windermere Cup on Saturday, May 1st, Opening Day of boating season. The team and their boat will be available from 8:30a until 10a at West Montlake Park (on the corner of E Shelby St. and W Park Dr E... by the Windermere Cup finish line).

They can discuss 30 foot waves v. a 29-foot rowboat, losing 45 pounds in 72 days on the open sea, things that go bump in the night (they're sure it was a shark)...and why Jordan and Greg want to do it all over again.

Somehow they convinced Adam and Richard to join them for a Mid-Atlantic race in December 2011. Their epic journey will benefit *Right to Play International*.

The boat itself, the James Robert Hanssen, is a piece of maritime history, as it is the first rowboat to cross from mainland U.S. to mainland U.K.
